Course Content:

Paint a pretty half or quarter sheet scene depicting an older Victorian home all snuggled in for winter.

Learn how to render snow under the warm glow of a winter evening.

Suitable for Christmas gifts or cards.

Supplies:

1. 300 lb. Cold press watercolour paper 100% rag – no substitutions please. Size 15x22 or 22x30
2. large pallet
3. any good quality watercolour paint you have, including cad orange, azo yellow light, burnt sienna, Hooker's green dark, Prussian blue and any red or pink.
4. brushes – 1" flat or bigger, No. 12 round, No. 8 round and a No. 4 or 5 round
5. a board for backing, at least 16 x 24 inch or 24 x 36 inch.
6. transfer or graphite paper
7. frisket
8. from your home, a large water bucket, one roll of paper towels, pencil and eraser, and 1-inch masking tape.
